Evening Prayer, 6 p.m.

The solemnity of the Triduum is accentuated by the stripping down of the Office to its stark essence. No candles are lit on these days. The Gloria Patri is omitted at all points.

The Office begins immediately with the Psalms.

The Psalms are recited quietly, alternating from side to side by verse, the odd-numbered verses recited on the Gospel side with the Officiant and the even-numbered on the Epistle side, with a distinct pause at the asterisk.

Collect of the Day

The Collect simply trails off into the silence, with no concluding Amen. After a suitable period for reflection, the Officiant rises and departs in silence.
